Tift County Emergency Operations

Tift County Emergency Operations consists of 22 full-time employees and 5 part-time employees (one of these employees is solely dedicated to the EMA side of the department.)

E-911 Communication Officer Essential Duties

A Communication Officer processes and handles incoming 911 and other telephone calls, determining the type of call, obtaining necessary information, and insuring that the call receives the response mandated by departmental policy.

A Communication Officer is also responsible for the operation of radios, telephones, recording systems, computer systems, enhanced 911 equipment, alarm systems, security systems, and various criminal justice information systems.

E-911 Communication Officers also receive and process radio communication from various public safety providers, while maintaining appropriate records of all communications.

Applicants must meet the following requirements:

1. Must be at least 18 years of age.
2. Must have a high school diploma or equivalent.
3. Must be a citizen of the United States.
4. Must be able to type 30 words per minute.
5. Successfully pass a Physical and Drug Screen.
6. Successfully pass an extensive background check, including a criminal history record check (no felony convictions or criminal record that shows a disregard for the law.)

Tift County E-911 Benefits and Programs

The descriptions of the benefits listed below are not described in absolute detail; some restrictions to the benefits may apply. For complete and detailed information, contact the Human Resource Office at the Charles Kent Administration Building.

1. Great starting pay—\$11.54
2. Retirement, Health, Dental, & Life Insurance Plans
3. Educational Incentives—College Tuition Reimbursements up to 100%.
4. 80 hours of Holiday Leave given each year. Also accrue 8 hours a month Sick Leave, and up to 10 hours a month (depending on length of full-time status) of Annual Leave a month.
5. Paid Funeral Leave.

2. Criminal & Driver History check
3. 3-Hour Dispatch Observation
4. Panel Interviews
5. Background Check
6. Final Interview (if score in top percentage of panels)
7. Physical & Drug Screen
